

TOWN OF MORRIS
BY-LAW NO. 12/15

BEING A BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF MORRIS TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION AND CONTROL OF GARAGE SALES WHICH SHALL INCLUDE RUMMAGE SALE, YARD SALE AND ANY LIKE ACTIVITY.

WHEREAS, the provision of the Municipal Act, L.M. 1996, c.58 – Chap. M225 provide in part as follows:

Sec 232 (1) A Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people, and the safety and protection of property;....
- b) Subject to section 233, activities or things in or on private property;
- c) The enforcement of by-laws

Sec 232 (2) Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), a council may in bylaw passed under this division:

- a) regulate or prohibit

Sec 233

A by-law under clause 232 (1)(c) (activities or things in or on private property) may contain provisions only in respect of:
b) activities or things that in the opinion of the council are or could become a nuisance, which may include noise, weeds, odors, unsightly property, fumes and vibrations.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable and in the best interest of the Town of Morris to pass such a by-law for the regulation and control of garage sales.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Morris, duly assembled as follows:

1. Garage Sales

- a. For the purpose of this section, Garage Sales shall also include Rummage Sale, Yard Sale Home Craft Sale and any like activity.
- b. A maximum of 2 garage sales in each calendar year may be conducted on each private residential property and or commercial property within the Town of Morris.
- c. A garage sale may not be conducted for a period of more than 2 consecutive days.
- d. Any person conducting a garage sale must comply with and is subject to all the provisions of the Town of Morris Traffic By-Law, and in relation to the erection and removal of any sign advertising such garage sale.
- e. The 2 garage sale maximum on each private residential property and or commercial property does not include the Town Wide Garage Sale.

2. Offenses and Penalties

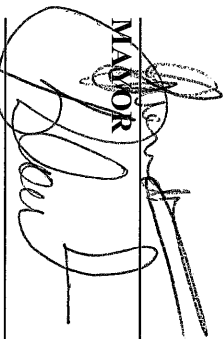
- a. Subject to this section, any Person who contravenes or disobeys or refuses or neglects to obey any provision of this by-law, is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of not less than \$500.00 and not more than \$1,000.00 as set out in Regulation 50/97 of The Municipal Act.

3. Commencement of By-Law

- a. This by-Law comes into force on the day after it received final reading
